Concours Mondial de Bruxelles 2011 (Chile)

Gold Medal Sepia Reserva Cabernet Sauvignon 2010

This wine comes from the Maipo Valley, with its characteristically deep, loamy-clay soils of alluvial origin. The climate is semi-arid Mediterranean, with a wide temperature range that enhances the ripening of the grapes.

Colour: deep red with hints of violet.

Aroma: ripe black fruits, blended with mocha and chocolate.

Flavour: notes of wood and black fruits with a smooth body, sweet and persistent ripe fruits.

Match food: game, such as boar or venison, and red meats in general.

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88 puntos – Best Buy Late Harvest Moscatel 2010

This wine is from the Limarí Valley, where there is a wide variety of different soil types and climates as one proceeds from the Pacific Ocean to the Andes Mountains. This valley, located in the north of Chile, has a very suitable climate for long, slow grape development. This gives the fruit unique organoleptic characteristics.

Colour: straw yellow with golden highlights.

Aroma: white flowers, white peaches, apricots and quinces.

Flavour: figs and dried peaches, well balanced by natural acidity.

Match food: roquefort cheese, pâté de foie gras, tarts, cheesecake and desserts.
